Addendum 2008-6 Landscape Guidelines

On June 10, 2008, Lake Arrowhead Community Services District adopted ordinance No. 69. One of the provisions of that ordinance specifically states that a property owner may only irrigate their property per LACSD regulations, not ALA property or other adjacent land. As a result, ALA will consider only the following plant list that can be established with proper planting, mulching, and minimal manual watering on ALA property. A landscape plan with fire safe and natural spacing to create a forest like setting will be required and may include:

CONIFERS:

Bigcone Doug-Fir	<i>Pseudotsuga macrocarpa*</i>

BROADLEAF:

Canyon Live Oak	<i>Quercus chrysolepis</i>	
Interior Live Oak	<i>Quercus wislizeni</i>	

SHRUBS:

Four-Wing Saltbush	<i>Atriplex canescens</i>
Manzanita variety	<i>Arctostaphylos densiflora</i> 'HowardMcMinn'
Cotoneaster varieties	<i>Cotoneaster</i> spp.
Oregon Grape	<i>Mahonia aquifolium</i>
Coffeeberry	<i>Rhamnus californica</i>
California Bay	<i>Umbellularia californica*</i>

ACCENTPLANTS(plant sparingly):

Western Redbud	<i>Cercis occidentalis</i>	Deciduous small tree
Pacific Dogwood	<i>Cornus nuttallii**</i>	Deciduous small tree
Flowering Plum	<i>Prunus cerasifera</i> var.	Deciduous small tree/shrub
Cinquefoil	<i>Potentilla fruticosa</i>	Shrubby perennial
Wild Rose	<i>Rosa californica</i>	Deciduous
Russian Sage	<i>Perovskia</i> var.	Shrubby perennial
Deer Grass	<i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i>	Perennial
Yarrow	<i>Achillea</i> spp.	Perennial
Daffodil bulbs	<i>Narcissus</i> var.	Naturalizing varieties

GROUNDCOVERS(limited areas):

Kinnikinnick	<i>Arctostaphylos uva-ursi</i>
Evening Primrose	<i>Oenothera</i> spp.

*Not advised in windy areas

**Best in protected areas with some shade and natural moisture
