**THIS COMMUNICATION INCLUDES VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION RELATED TO
YOUR ASSOCIATION, ITS RULES AND PROCEDURES**

We are rapidly approaching the 2008 season at Lake Arrowhead and it looks like it will be another great summer, a fantastic one with a little more precipitation. Membership in our Association is a right of property owners in Arrowhead Woods and is exercised by those families and individuals that want the very best in private water based recreation. Lake Arrowhead is a private lake that is not open to the public. **It's our lake.** Membership is valued, exclusive and strictly voluntary. By choosing to join the Association, our MEMBERS agree to abide by the terms of membership and associate with other individuals and families who understand the benefits of membership.

This year's membership fees and boat registration fees are listed below. You will notice some changes that will help us serve you better. If you have any question regarding membership fees and boat registration fees, please call the office at 909-337-2595 for clarification.

Specifics for 2008 include the following:

- Memberships are available in the following categories
 1. Slip Right (Dock) Membership \$500
 2. Beach Club Membership \$200
 3. General Membership \$ 60

- Following the selection of one of the above memberships boats may be registered as follows:
 1. Power or Sail Boat with Slip Right Membership, Slip rental or "summer storage" - \$200
 2. Power or Sail Boat without Slip Right Membership, Slip rental or "summer storage" - \$300
 3. Small Non-powered Boats (includes canoes, kayaks, peddle boats, sculls, etc.) - \$ 25

- DMV Registration is required for power and sail boats prior to the purchase of a boat registration decal. California DMV Registration is valid through December 31, 2009. Your new California DMV sticker will be blue and have "09" on the sticker. NO power or sail boat may be launched on Lake Arrowhead or stored on the shoreline without current DMV and ALA registration. Expiration dates for registrations from other states vary and must be current.

IMPROVEMENTS ON ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

Arrowhead Lake Association property consists of the shoreline around the lake, the bottom of the lake and all property between the shoreline and the rear property lines of lots adjacent to Arrowhead Lake Association property. The Arrowhead Lake Association also has property rights on many easements and along some watercourses contiguous to the lake. Any improvement* or modification of an existing improvement on Arrowhead Lake Association property must have the express written consent of the Association. Members desiring to place any improvement on Association property, or desiring to repair or modify any existing

improvement, must contact Association staff to obtain proper forms and detailed information regarding approvable improvements. When clearing green waste, please leave 2” of duff on the forest floor. General information is available at www.ala-ca.org.

**Improvements include not only docks, piers and gangways, but also dock boxes, storage buildings (dock houses), electrical or plumbing work, landscaping, landscape irrigation, paving (including stairs and walkways), sand addition to the shoreline, wall construction or grading and any other improvement determined by ALA to require a permit.*

It is the goal of the Association to maintain an environment that is as natural as possible. The Association has established standards that are intended to protect the aesthetics of the lake and the Association’s surrounding property.

****SPECIAL INITIATIVE FOR 2008* - During the coming year, ALA staff will be surveying the shoreline and requesting that members address the following issues:***

- ***Debris and construction material should be removed from the shoreline and the reserve strip by the members.***
- ***Dock boxes should be removed from the shoreline and attached to Piers, Walkways or Docks. Dock Boxes or other storage units in disrepair should be removed.***
- ***Docks, gangways, piers and walkways in disrepair must be repaired pursuant to members’ obligations to maintain improvements in good repair.***

NOTE All contractors (dock contractors, general contractors, electrical contractors, landscape contractors and any other contractor of any specialty) working on Arrowhead Lake Association property must be registered with the Association, must be appropriately licensed by the State of California and must provide ALA General Liability and Workman’s Compensation insurance naming the ALA as “Additional insured” for the work performed on Association property. Please have your contractors register with the ALA office before you contract for work on ALA property. This will help ensure that you do not experience untimely delays with your project. Unregistered contractors will be considered trespassers and will be asked to leave.

BOATS AND BOATING ON LAKE ARROWHEAD

Boating on Lake Arrowhead is a right extended only to owners of real property in Arrowhead Woods choosing to be members of ALA. This restriction helps protect our lake from overcrowding and allows the Association to enforce boating rules for the protection of the lake and the safety of our members. All operators of boats (including canoes, kayaks and pedal boats) on Lake Arrowhead must possess a license for boat operation issued by the Association. Licenses are issued only after the successful completion of a written test at the Association offices. Complete Boating Rules and Regulations are available at the Arrowhead Lake Association office or online under Boating Rules. For new and old boaters alike, we offer FREE safe boating classes. (see below*)

LAKE SAFETY

Your Lake Safety employees are on the water and the shoreline to help you and to enforce the Association rules. This dedicated group of men and women are tasked with helping the Association members in many ways including retrieval of loose or lost boats and equipment, rendering aid in times of crisis and assisting the general membership with having a pleasant and safe season on our lake.

The Lake Safety employees have advanced training in many areas including Life Saving, CPR and the use of defibrillators, deep-water rescue and general law enforcement. Your Lake Safety employees are not a police force. The Association relies on the San Bernardino Sheriff, local Fire Departments and the Department of Fish and Game to be the professionals policing the lake when necessary.

*Lake Safety employees are available to accompany any member on their boat and to provide FREE safe boating classes. The employee will point out areas of congestion, boating hazards, rules of the road (both State of California and ALA rules), areas that are good for fishing or skiing, and general information a boater will need to operate a boat safely on our waterway. These free services are primarily designed for newcomers to Lake Arrowhead but are available to any member and are especially valuable to our younger members that have just obtained their first boating license. Safety Cruises generally take place on a Saturday morning beginning in mid-June. Your boat needs to be in the water and you must have completed your membership and boat registrations to take advantage of this opportunity. BOAT REGISTRATION

While it may be obvious that motorized boats must be registered, it may not be obvious that canoes, kayaks, pedal boats and similar craft must also be registered and must display an ALA decal. With that decal in place, we can determine the ownership of the small boat and return it to the member's dock if it ends up across the lake. Staff will remove unregistered boats from the lake. Please include all watercraft that you intend to use on the lake on your registration form.

OH, WHAT A GREAT PLACE TO FISH

The fishing in our lake has never been better. ALA has been a careful steward to our fishery. Our lake is home to both Large Mouth and Small Mouth Bass as well as Rainbow Trout. Crappie and Bluegill are also found in abundance. Rainbow Trout are planted in the lake annually. Many years ago the ALA board adopted a catch and release policy for bass that has assisted in making Lake Arrowhead one of the better fisheries in Southern California. Although Lake Arrowhead is a private lake, state fishing licenses are required.

DOGS ON ARROWHEAD LAKE ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

San Bernardino County has an ordinance requiring that dogs be on a leash and under control when they are not secured on 'private property'. The following is from the County Website:

Is there a leash law?

Yes. When not secured on private property a dog must be secured with a leash and be controlled by someone who can handle the dog. Responsible pet owners that walk their dogs on a leash do not have to worry about their precious pet being hit by a car, becoming stolen or lost, getting into a fight with another animal, or injuring someone. If you love your dog — LEASH them — it's the LAW!

Arrowhead Lake Association property is “private property” and we require that dogs be on a leash or under the owner’s control when on Association property. The reason for this rule is to allow members to enjoy the lake, the trails and shoreline with their dogs and to help ensure the safety of members from dangerous, aggressive and overly playful dogs. ALSO: Owner’s must pick up their dogs waste and properly dispose of the waste for sanitary purposes.

There are special rules at the Beach Clubs (Tavern Bay and Burnt Mill) and at the Parks (Grass Valley and Peninsula). Dogs are allowed at the Beach Clubs and at the Parks under the following conditions:

- Dogs must be on a leash and must not be allowed on the beaches.
- Dogs must be attended by an owner and may not be left tied and unattended.
- Dogs are allowed in the parking lots and the picnic areas.
- Owners must pick up after their dogs.

Any owner that is not willing to abide by these rules will be asked to remove the dog from the Arrowhead Lake Association property. Members who do not comply with the above rules may be subject to verbal warnings, written warnings and/or citation. Citations may result in fines as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

SECURITY DISCLAIMER

We hope that the presence of our Patrol and Maintenance staff on and around Lake Arrowhead will provide deterrence to crime. However, no matter the steps we take, Association lands and waters can never be completely safe and secure. Lake Arrowhead and the surrounding Association property is not and can never be totally free of crime and we cannot guarantee your safety or security. Accordingly, you should NOT rely solely on the Association to protect you from loss or harm. Instead, you should provide for your own security by taking common sense precautions such as carrying insurance against loss; securing your boats and other recreational equipment; asking workmen for identification; and notifying the Arrowhead Lake Association offices [(909)-337-2595] of suspicious activity when it is observed. REMEMBER, for emergencies the number to call is 9-1-1.

In closing, our members are members of an Association that, with their help, is the steward of a wonderful resource. We are anticipating a great summer in 2008 and are looking forward to seeing you again.

Our Board of Directors and the staff of our Association are committed to providing our MEMBERS the best possible recreation experience at Lake Arrowhead. We are here to serve MEMBERS’ needs while protecting the rights of all ALA members. We are a part of your community.

The Lake Activities & Safety Committee is responsible for the review and recommendations to the Board of Directors of those issues that relate to Lake activities and safety.

The primary responsibilities of the Lake Activities and Safety Committee are as follows:

1. Review, enforce and recommend rules and policies regarding lake activity and safety on ALA properties, including but not limited to: boating, swimming, and towed devices and sailing.
2. Review and make recommendations regarding testing of boat operators and issuance of ALA boat operators license.
3. Review and make recommendations regarding allowable size and types of crafts, vessels, etc.
4. Review and make recommendations regarding fines associated with noncompliance of Boat Membership Rules, Boating & Swimming Rules, Fishing Rules and any Lake Activities & Safety Policy or Procedure.
5. Conduct hearings of violations cited by Lake Safety Personnel, or as provided for in the Association membership rules.

Many people enjoying the Lake, choose to enjoy alcohol as well. A major factor in many boating accidents is an intoxicated operator, and people not being aware of their surroundings. Remember, getting a BUI (Boating While Under the Influence) citation or arrest carries the same penalties as a DUI (Driving Under the Influence).

Shoreline Improvements Committee:

Purpose

The Shoreline Member Improvements Committee is responsible for the review and recommendation to the Board of Directors of those issues that relate to member shoreline improvements (i.e., docks, piers, patios, dock houses and utilities).

Responsibilities

Review and recommend policies regarding Member improvements to ALA Properties and dock placement.

Review and update the Regulations for Member Improvements on ALA Properties.

Review and recommend policies regarding the Slip Membership Rules with respect to dock maintenance and repair.

Process Applications for Shoreline Member Improvements submitted by Members or approved contractors and sent to committee by ALA Staff.

Accountability

The Shoreline Committee shall be accountable to the Board of Directors and shall report all actions and decisions. All policy recommendations shall come before the Board for approval.

In 1974, I was one of the ten original founders of ALA, and served as the principal negotiator when ALA acquired the Lake and other assets from Boise Cascade in 1975. I then served as the first elected president of ALA until 1978. Since that time, I have served many times on the Board in all of the official positions.

As a civil engineer specializing in water resources, I have full knowledge of how our two lakes function, and how they can be stabilized to serve both water supply and recreational purposes. I wanted to return to the Board in order to ensure that the stability is achieved on behalf of our membership and the community of Arrowhead Woods. I also want to help and support the capable staff of ALA in carrying out the mission of ALA in its service to the ALA membership.

What Is It?

The tunnel outlet from the Grass Valley Tunnel was completed in 1907. It discharges water into a creek that runs into Lake Arrowhead's Meadow Bay.

Excavated in fractured rock, the tunnel measures 4,172 feet (0.79 mile) long, about 5 feet high and 3'3" wide. After the tunnel was completed a portion of the tunnel, including the invert or bottom, was lined with concrete as a stabilizing measure. The bottom slope of the tunnel drops approximately 3" every 100 feet toward Lake Arrowhead.

The rout of the tunnel is from west to east, generally parallel to Tunnel Drive, 100 to 200 feet south of it, at a maximum depth of about 475 feet.

The Grass Valley Tunnel was an important link in the overall, stupendous Arrowhead Reservoir and Power Company project. The centerpiece was the Lake Arrowhead Dam constructed in Little Bear Valley to impound the natural drainage of Little Bear Creek, and to receive water diverted all the way from Deep, Crab and Holcomb Creeks in another tunnel, as well as the flow from smaller streams (Fern, Shake and Cedar Creeks) entering through deep shafts connected to the Deep Creek Tunnel.

The only other tunnel designed to bring water *into* Lake Arrowhead was the Grass Valley Tunnel. There was to be another dam constructed in Grass Valley, 90 feet high, with a storage capacity of 7,632 acre-feet (2.5 billion gallons). This dam was never built and up until the existing low dam was built in 1956-57, water was diverted from Grass Valley by a ditch to and through the connecting Grass Valley Tunnel into Lake Arrowhead. The amounts would vary from year to year, depending on precipitation and the condition of the ditch, but could get as high as about 4,000 acre-feet, enough to put about 5 feet of water in Lake Arrowhead. This diversion occurred without regard to the riparian water rights of downstream property owners. The low dam is only about 25 feet high but it created Grass Valley Lake as we know it today, with a storage volume of about 130 acre-fee (43 million gallons), a far cry from what was envisioned in the original Lake Arrowhead project.

Nevertheless, since Grass Valley Lake is about 36 feet higher in elevation than Lake Arrowhead, it is possible to divert flow from the Grass Valley watershed by gravity through the Grass Valley Tunnel in order to augment the level of Lake Arrowhead.

In the early 1960s, Las Flores Ranch Corporation and the Mojave River County Water District brought suit against Lake Arrowhead Development Company (LADCO) et al (including Arrowhead Utility Company) for adjudication of water in Grass Valley Creek.

At that time the LADCO owned the country club lands, its other land holdings within Arrowhead Woods (which includes Grass Valley), the Arrowhead Utility Co., Lake Arrowhead and the pre-1914 appropriate water rights association therewith. The LADCO had historically diverted as much water as possible from Grass Valley to Lake Arrowhead up to the capacity of the Grass Valley Tunnel. In addition, the country club lands owned by the LADCO were (and still are) riparian to Grass Valley Creek.

In its decision through stipulated judgment rendered on June 8, 1966, the court recognized that all parties had riparian and/or appropriative rights to the water flowing in Grass Valley Creek. And so it goes in adjudication. The court simply divided it up by saying that LADCO could divert, use or export up to *one-half* of the water in

Grass Valley Creek, except that it *cannot exceed 800 acre-feet* (26.7 million gallons or about one foot on Lake Arrowhead) *in any given year*. All the rest of the water has to go downstream to the plaintiffs.

There must be a flow of *at least* 1600 acre-feet into Grass Valley Lake in any given water year (October 1 to September 30), in order for ALA to divert *as much as, but no more than, 800 acre-feet* into Lake Arrowhead. This may not happen every year.

In there is *1600 acre-feet available* in any give water year, and ALA *divests less than 800 acre-feet* to Lake Arrowhead, ALA can claim *credit* to be *added* to the next year's 800 acre-fee diversion if the total then does not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ the flow into Grass Valley Lake. If not exercised the first succeeding water year, the credit can be exercised with the same limitation the second succeeding water year but not beyond.

Clearly, in my opinion, Arrowhead Lake Association is the successor to Lake Arrowhead Development Co. with respect to pre-1914 appropriative water rights, ownership of Grass Valley Dam and the Grass Valley Tunnel interconnecting the two lakes. Lake Arrowhead Community Services District must be the successor to Arrowhead Utility Co. or else LACSD would have no appropriative right to extract water from Lake Arrowhead. LADCO's riparian rights to water in Grass Valley Creek were transferred to the Lake Arrowhead Country Club, when the country club purchased the golf course through which the creek passes. *Without Grass Valley Dam* (owned by ALA) *to impound the water, the country club's irrigation pumps would run dry.*

Obviously, Grass Valley Lake, the Dam and Grass Valley Tunnel are important to all of us in Lake Arrowhead Woods. ALA, Lake Arrowhead Community Services District and Lake Arrowhead Country Club should continue to work cooperatively to operate and maintain these assets.
